#### Parent Teacher Orientation Meetings

Please add to your calendar the parent teacher information sessions which have been arranged for the week beginning Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> February. Starting at 3:15pm parents will be able to meet each other and their child's teacher. This meeting will give you the opportunity to also meet your child's teacher and be informed about class routines and upcoming events. Meetings will conclude at 4pm, giving a 45 minute time slot. The meeting is not meant to deal with specific issues relating to your child. If you need to see your child's teacher please phone to make a mutually suitable meeting time. The class information sessions for:

- KT, K/1D and 5/6H will be held between 3:15pm and 4pm on Monday 15 February in each classroom.
- 1S, 1/2D and 4/5P will be held between 3:15pm and 4pm on Tuesday 16 February, with 4/5P held in the Library. 1S and 1/2D meetings will be held in their classrooms.
- 3G and 2/3C will be held between 3:15pm and 4pm on Wednesday 17 February, with 3G held in the Library and 2/3C in their classroom.

All children whose parents are attending meetings will be supervised by teachers in the playground for the duration of the meeting. We look forward to seeing you at the meetings and to working with you for the betterment of your child.

#### Before School:

If your child arrives at school just before the 9am bell, they are to go to the Primary COLA, remain seated and wait for the teacher on duty to take them around to the K-6 area to play. The children will leave their bags in the allocated areas when going to the playground.

## Afternoon Pickup

Parents of Kinder students and their siblings are asked to be at the back gate for afternoon pickup at 3pm. The "Kiss and Ride" is in operation, but it is important that the following recommendations are adhered to for the "Kiss and Ride" to work effectively:

- Please don't leave your car, (morning or afternoon). You may stand within 3m of your car to show your child you are there.
- Your car may only be parked in the "Kiss and Ride" for 2 minutes.
- Your child will come to your car, take their own bag off and get themselves into the car. Please practice your child doing up their seatbelt on their own.

Remember the "Kiss and Ride" should be smooth flowing, please don't overtake other cars using the "Kiss and Ride", be patient!!! Parents are asked to please pick up their Yrs 1-6 children promptly at 3:15pm from the back gate. Children will be brought to the office if no-one is there to pick them up. Teachers are rostered on bus duty each afternoon at the Smith St gate, and wait with them until they are collected. I will be on back gate pick up also.
