
Let's Love Water Show

Last week our K-2 students attended the Let's Love Water Show that was provided for free by Hunter Water. The show outlined ways to save water in our homes in a fun and interactive way. There were lots of laughs from our students and the knowledge of the need to conserve water and protect our water sources increased. The school was also provided with some seed sticks after the show which will be used in coming weeks by our Grow Getters.

New Smart MX panels

Last week our old smart boards were replaced with new SMART MX panels in every learning space in the school. These panels have many learning tools that can be accessed even when not connected to a These computer. include organisers, dice, spinners, rulers, grid paper, writing and recording tools as well as an internet browser. When connected to a computer, either wired or wirelessly any displayed image or text can be drawn or written on and annotations saved. Two people are able to write on or move objects around the screen at the same time. SMART Notebook software that comes with the board also has lots of interactive features that teachers will be incorporating in future lessons. Staff had some training on how to use these new panels this morning and will have additional training opportunities next term. Staff and students have been learning together through trial and error how to best use these panels and I am having new uses reported to me frequently. The staff and students are very excited about this new learning tool!





Harmony Day

Last Friday we celebrated Harmony Day as a school. The students participated in a range of activities that promoted multiculturalism, inclusion and a sense of belonging. The highlight of the day was an interactive dance workshop. Shyamla taught the students dance moves from the dance styles Brazilian Samba, Hip Hop and Bollywood.
